FLUORESCENT MICROSCOPE - MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Rtn Babu Kanakasabai from RC Victoria Campbell Town, Australia, was the prime mover for our Global Grant project that helped to install a Fluorescent Microscope at the VHS - This microscope enables one to identify Fungi that are an outcome of post-Covid infection. The installation not only helped quick identification but also reduced the time taken to identify to just 15 Minutes compared to the 24 hours or more it took with the regular microscope.

The Fluorescent Microscope is being used since November 2022 after it was inaugurated by DG Rtn Nandakumar.

Rtn Babu who is based out of Melbourne was visiting India and so took the opportunity to visit VHS on 4th April and get familiarized with the equipment. Rtn Renjit Joseph and Rtn R Srikanth accompanied Rtn Babu. The team was received by Dr Priya, Head of Lab Services at VHS. Dr Priya explained the salient features of the Microscope and other ancillary equipment to the team. Dr Priya also informed that the usage had trebled in the first quarter of 2023 compared to the last quarter of 2022.

It was gratifying to note the project benefitted the public at large and was also a true sign of international collaboration among Rotary Clubs in addressing Health needs.



AUTISM AWARENESS CAMP HELD



Rtn Kalpana Kumar, who runs the 'Kare Therapy Center' for special children conducted a camp in association with RCMS at the Montfort Matriculation HS School, Chennai on 1st April. The camp included a dental check-up in association with the 'Right Smile Dental Clinic.' It also had experts conducting job evaluations and assessments for adults with autism. Around 200 students and parents attended the camp getting opinions on speech therapy, behaviour management and
